INSTITUTE FOR CHILD DEVELOPMENT AND FAMILY RELATIONS (ICDFR)

The ICDFR's "primary mission is to serve the needs of children and families" in the Inland Empire and beyond. The institute provides a gamut of services and leads several research projects, sponsored by external agencies. These projects, among many others include a school-based program BeFast to facilitate






development of the essential student's academic skill, Quality Start San Bernardino program focused on assessing and improving the quality of child-care



in San Bernadine County and the Infant/Toddler lab School which provides teaching, research and services to the university and wider community.

Much of the ICDFR impact comes through partnerships with agencies in the local community who provide financial support and resources, access to research populations, training sites, while CSUSB faculty provide discipline specific expertise to carry out the ICDFR's projects. Under the leadership of **DR. MARK AGARS**, Director of ICDFR and a Professor in the Department of Psychology, the instituted continued to expand its programs and services by successfully securing extramural funding.
